WHO CAN BE A STEWARD: Any WVMFT, AFT Local 6554 dues paying faculty member in good standing is eligible to serve as a steward. Both Associate (part-time), and full-time faculty members are encouraged to apply.

HOW MUCH TIME WILL IT TAKE: Approximately 3-5 hours per month (one monthly meeting plus checking in with faculty members in your cluster area)

HOW TO JOIN THE STEWARD COUNCIL: Submit a letter of interest and list of 5 faculty members who support you representing your constituency/cluster area.
